

Disappearing Nine-Patch

Just like a magician's trick... It's made from 4" squares. The whole thing (except borders.) NO KIDDING! This is a fascinating pattern and amazingly EASY! Super for beginners, but the experienced quilters will enjoy it, too. Make a baby, lap, or twin sized quilt. In class, we will make the quilt top. There will be homework, but not too much!

Background Fabric I used off-white. This amount includes enough for the inner border also.	1 1/8 yard	1 1/2 yard	1 3/4 yard	2 3/4 yard
Fabric A - used for the small dark squares - use a solid or near-solid that contrasts well with your other fabrics.	3/8 yard	3/8 yard	3/8 yard	2/3 yard
Fabric B - used for the large squares - use a medium fabric that contrasts well with your other fabrics.	3/4 yard	1 yard	1 1/4 yard	2 1/4 yard
OR				
Fabric B - Use several different-but-similar prints that contrast well with the background fabric.	6 - 1/8 yard pieces	8 - 1/8 yard pieces	10 - 1/8 yard pieces OR 5 - 1/4 yard pieces	18 - 1/8 yard pieces OR 9 - 1/4 yard pieces
Outer Border and Binding	1 yard	1 1/4 yard	1 1/2 yard	1 3/4 yard
Backing	1 1/2 yard	3 yards	3 1/4 yard	5 1/4 yard

Batting - you will need batting slightly larger than your quilt top

Purchase 100% cotton quilting fabric. Prewash in warm water and dry in the dryer before class.

You will also need:

- Sewing Machine in good working order
- Rotary cutting equipment
- Thread to blend with the background fabric
- Scissors, seam ripper, straight pins
